



ID Requirements for FAA Testing

International students (non-U.S. citizens)

Non-U.S. citizens are required to provide two forms of ID to be eligible for FAA knowledge (written) tests, and for oral & practical examinations.

Here are your two options for meeting the FAA testing ID requirements:

Option 1

- **Primary ID:** passport
- **Secondary ID:** another form of government or state issued ID, such as a driver's license or government ID, that has your home address on it

If international students choose option 1 (a passport and country or state ID with their address on it), then they do not need any additional documents for address verification.

Option 2

- **Primary ID:** passport
- **Secondary ID:** visa page in your passport

You must show proof (such as a vehicle registration, electric bill, state or other official government document) of your home address if you are using option 2 (passport and visa) as your two forms of identification.
